We will ensure that these improvements are sustainable by establishing firm links with surrounding primary schools as well as feeder secondary schools to ensure that inter and intra school competitions continue as well as establishing training hubs for our teachers and TAs to attend to further their abilities in delivering physical education.

### **Effect of the premium on pupils' PE and sports participation and attainment**

Our pupils' PE and Sports participation has increased significantly over the 2017/18 academic year. A key reason for this has been the fact that all children have received an additional 50 minutes per week of physical education on top of what they received last year. This has primarily been due to our outdoor learning sessions that happen every week for each year group. On top of this, we've also had a 21% increase in after school PE club participation. We believe that subsidising two of the available clubs has enabled this positive figure of 21% to be achieved.

### **Year 6**
