Outdoor learning		<del>Outdoor learning will be starting for all children after Christmas. It will be run by one of our job-share teachers who has been trained in outdoor learning. The sessions will compliment and support the learning going on in class by covering key objectives set by the class teachers. Each Year group will have a 45-60 minute session of outdoor learning per week. 'Active learning' will be the theme of every session.</del> Outdoor learning will now be run by class teachers. All resources and further training will be covered by the Sports Premium funding. Outdoor learning for Robin class will still be run separately from the main class routine.	

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<b>Pupil health and wellbeing.</b> (mental health support, nutrition education, British values and cultural diversity links).		Multi-cultural sporting activities to promote British values and cultural diversity: In November, we'll be having a whole day of dance, music and excitement with the Mighty Zulu Nation theatre company. Every child will have 2 hours worth of activities followed by a performance to parents at the end of the day.  West End Dance – 7 <sup>th</sup> March – linked to world book day. All children to create dance sequences around famous book i.e. the Iron Man  Bassistry music festival will be run at school on 18 <sup>th</sup> June 2019. Geared towards dance and music. Years 5/6 to perform what they've learnt at a partnership show-case later in June 2019.

We will ensure that these improvements are sustainable by establishing firm links with surrounding primary schools as well as feeder secondary schools to ensure that inter and intra school competitions continue as well as establishing training hubs for our teachers and TAs to attend to further their abilities in delivering physical education.
